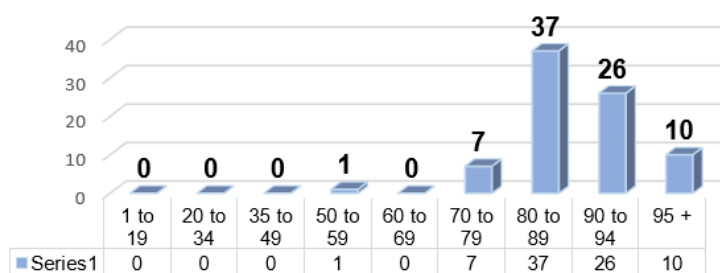
East Dunbartonshire (Covid - 19) Update

The latest statistics from Scottish Government, dated up to 5 July 2020 (week 1 - week 27 of the pandemic) show that 516 East Dunbartonshire residents had tested positive for Covid-19 infection and that, unfortunately, 137 local people have died as a consequence of the pandemic virus.

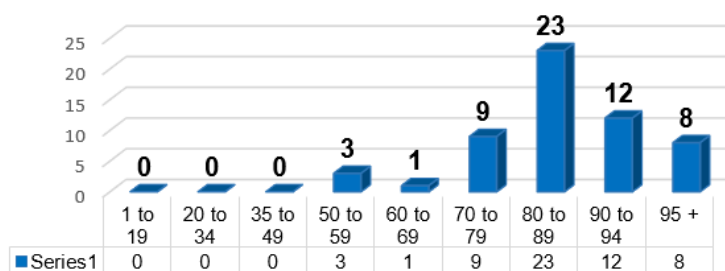
The East Dunbartonshire Public, Service User and Carer (PSUC) group thank the local residents, Patients, Service Users and Carers, who, for the most, have responded quickly and positively to the Scottish Governments lockdown requests and observed socially distancing. These individual and collective efforts have helped to keep the spread of this virus to a relatively low rate and we ask that you continue to follow the advice and guidance issued by the Scottish Government.

SHEILDING UPDATE

The Scottish Government are asking people in the shielding group to take extra steps to reduce their risk of catching coronavirus.

Their advice is to keep shielding until at least **31 July 2020**; and in so doing:

- stay at home as much as possible
- avoid going places that are indoors
- only leave home to be active or meet with people from another household outdoors
- keep 2 metres away from everyone, even people from the same household, and;
- Before going outside, [read the guidance on how to stay safe outdoors](#).

Caroline Sinclair (Interim Chief Officer of East Dunbartonshire HSCP) strongly urges those who are shielding within East Dunbartonshire, to remain safe and well and to follow the above advice.

CARERS INFORMATION

CARE HOME VISITING

If the person you care for lives in a care home, from July 3 2020 one designated visitor can visit them. Please check with the care home before you go, as care homes have been given the option on whether to open to visitors, and that:

1. The care home has been covid free for / or fully recovered as agreed by Public Health for 28 days from last symptoms of any resident.
2. Visitors maintain a 2 metre physical distance
3. Staff and visitors must wear PPE
4. Hands are washed / sanitised
5. A strict cleaning regime is in place (in the care home)
